## 4.3 Race office

Race Office Cross-Country will be inside the main arena building in the Cross-Country arena. Race Office Nordic Combined CC will be located just outside of the main entrance for the arena building Cross-Country.

In the Ski Jumping arena, race office for both Ski Jumping and Nordic Combined SJ are in the main SJ-arena building, second floor, outside the team Hospitality area (Café Ljøken).

The opening hours will be in connection with training and competition times. More details in the team guide that will be sent out before the event.

## 4.4 Training opportunities

### Cross-country training courses

At Skistua, there will be courses for training outside Granåsen arena. Skistua is approximately 20 minutes' drive from the team hotels.

### Indoor

We offer free training for teams in indoor training halls nearby the two team hotels. There you can, for example, play volleyball or floor ball.

### Fitness center

We offer free training for athletes in Fitness center nearby the two team hotels. For team officials/trainers and SRS it will cost 10 CHF per visit. It is a public training center, but between 10am-1pm it will be WSC teams' access only.

For transport to indoor training and training courses, transportation must be booked before latest 8pm the day before. The booking request for both transport and training hours will be at the service desk in the two team hotels. The transportation is free of charge.


## 4.5 Team Attache





### 5.7 Lift access and opening times

During training and competition, priority access is given to the competitors, coaches, team personnel and officials on all lifts serving the respective runs. Follow the signs.

## 6. FIS World Championships Rules

### 8 Qualification Regulations

8.1 The eligibility for participation at the FIS World Championships and age groups are defined in the ICR.

8.2 The reigning FIS World Champions have the right to participate at the next FIS World Championships in the events they won, in addition to the team quota, under the condition they are entered by the same National Association (this is valid only for the individual competitions and not for the team competitions). If, however, the World Champions are also entered for other events, they must be included within the overall team quota.

8.3 The maximum number of athletes at each medal event shall be no more than 4 per National Ski Association plus the competitors according to art. 8.2. This rule does not apply to Para Snow Sports events.

8.4 The qualification criteria and the maximum number of athletes per nation at the qualification competitions and official trainings shall be as follows:

#### 8.6 Nordic Disciplines

##### 8.6.1 Cross-Country Events

###### **Qualification competitions and official trainings:**

12 athletes per gender plus the competitors according to art. 8.2.

###### **Minimum requirements:**

To be eligible for entry in the FIS World Championships the cross-country competitors must have 800 FIS points and less in the last FIS points list (distance or sprint) as published before the deadline for the provisional team selection.

Competitors who have 150 Distance FIS points and less on the last FIS points list published before the start of the FIS World Championships will be allowed to start in the distance competitions (Interval Start, Skiathlon and Mass Start).

A qualification competition will be scheduled for the athletes who did not meet these requirements. The athletes who have reached the above requirements are not allowed to start in the qualification race. The top 10 ranked competitors will be allowed to start in the Interval Start competitions as part of their nation's quota. The top 10 ranked competitors will be allowed to start in the Skiathlon and Mass Start competitions as part of their nation's quota under the condition that they have fewer than 200 FIS Distance points in the current FIS Distance points list.

4 athletes per gender plus the competitors according to art. 8.2.



For any extra single room including qualified athletes, if available, the LOC will charge 200 CHF per night (250 CHF per night for extra officials and special guests).

Accommodation needs for para-athletes for the period March 3<sup>rd</sup> – March 6<sup>th</sup> 2025, need to be registered in a separate registration form. The form will be available on the FIS Para Cross-Country Calendar Page.

Latest by 31<sup>st</sup> of October 2024 the number of double and single rooms requested, incl. accessible rooms and arrival/departure dates, must be communicated to the LOC (please see article 12.3). After receiving the preliminary entry, the LOC will send feedback to the NSA regarding the reservation. Allocation of extra rooms will be handled on a "first come first served" basis within available capacity.

When LOC has received the preliminary entry, the NSA will receive ongoing confirmation of details and feedback about the designated hotel, and no later than 15<sup>th</sup> of November 2024.

The LOC will not be responsible for teams that wish to take care of their own accommodation arrangements. Arranging accommodation outside of the LOC system is the sole responsibility of the NSA. As such, the NSA are responsible for transport, meals etc.

The LOC covers the cost of accommodation for qualified athletes according to rules in article 13.10. The rate will be at maximum price 120 CHF/person/night. Receipt must be presented.

Member companies of SRS must register through the FIS online system. In cooperation with the SRS Association, accreditation for the team hotels will be assigned. The cost for SRS accommodation will be 120 CHF per night.

### **Team payment deadlines and terms**

LOC will invoice the NSA based on the reservation made in preliminary entry and final entry according to the following dates:

Outstanding accommodation and remaining/extra costs to be paid by card at the financial office or invoiced.

If payment is not received before the due date, the LOC reserves the right to cancel the reservation.

Before 5<sup>th</sup> February 2025 (12.4.1 Provisional team selection), a National Ski Association can change their accommodation reservation by a maximum of 20% of the total nights without payment of a penalty as per art. 13.4. (additional requirements are subject to availability).

Reimbursement of the expenses according to the rules for free accommodation for qualified competitors will be paid as soon as possible but no later than 1<sup>st</sup> of April 2025.

### **Cancellation conditions**

Cancellations must be made via the FIS online entry system, and via email [accommodation@trondheim2025.no](mailto:accommodation@trondheim2025.no) for Para Cross-Country.

Cancellation may be done without charge, in case of:

- Cancellation of up to 100% of the original reservation is received before 31<sup>st</sup> of October 2024.
- Cancellation of up to 50% of the original reservation is received before 30<sup>th</sup> of November 2024.
- Cancellation of up to 20% of the original reservation is received before 5<sup>th</sup> of February 2025.

Booking details received by 5<sup>th</sup> of February 2025 will be considered as final and will be the basics for calculating the total payment, cancellation fees and charges for no-shows. In case of no-shows there will be no refund (100% of the booked reservation has to be paid). If a cancellation is received later than the above-mentioned dates, the NSA must pay 100% of the reservation.

### **7.1.3 Meals arrangements**

Breakfast, lunch and dinner will be provided at the team hotel.

At the venue, warm lunch will be available in the team hospitality area\*. The warm lunch will be served at specified times, and it will also be available coffee/tea, water, snacks and fruit.

The meals both at the hotel and in the team hospitality will correspond to the needs of highly competitive athletes and in line with FIS guidelines, in addition according to the recommendation from the Norwegian Olympic Top Sports Centre.

Team hospitality will have a chill area for athletes to relax and to prepare for competitions.

*\*Location for team hospitality is marked in arena map under sections 5.2 CC-arena and 5.7 SJ-arena.*

## **7.2 Transport and parking**

### **7.2.1 Transportation**

Transportation from the official airport, Værnes Airport, will be provided free of charge to the teams. The free service includes one trip per team per discipline in each direction. Please let us know how many bags and ski bags (SJ and CC ski bags) your team brings in order to organize an appropriate vehicle.

The LOC will provide a shuttle bus service between the team hotels and the venue, free of charge, that is tailored to the needs of athletes and service personnel to and from the arenas.

For independently booked accommodation, the transportation to the venue and back will be provided only for an extra cost. Request needs to be sent to [transport@trondheim2025.no](mailto:transport@trondheim2025.no) not later than 31<sup>st</sup> of January 2025.

There will also be LOC-cars that can be ordered by accredited persons if special needs, subject to available capacity.

### **7.2.2 Parking information**

There are limited parking spots at Granåsen arena. If the teams bring their own cars, it is possible to get drop-off permission with a valid accreditation card for one car per team, but then the car needs to be parked outside the arena/nearby the hotel. For service personnel, the LOC can offer 1-2 parking permissions to each team (depending on the size of the team) in walking distance to the team areas. The parking permissions will be given to the team captains at the accreditation office.

Teams will have parking spots available at the hotel. Nevertheless, they will remain limited. LOC offer 1-2 parking spots per team (depending on the size of the team) in connection to the hotels. If a team have several cars, they must pay a fee for the additional ones. We kindly ask all teams to come with as few vehicles as possible to avoid any parking difficulties as well as to adopt an approach of corporate social responsibility.

More detailed information will be sent together with the team guide.

### **7.2.3 Venue access information**

The main roads around the venues, both in Granåsen and city square, will be closed throughout the whole event. Valid accreditation card must be used to enter the venue.

## 7.4 Wax Cabins and wax trucks for teams and SRS Industry

### Cross-country team area

Wax cabins are located in Team area 1 as described in the CC venue map. There will be cabins of two or three heights in rows of 8. Every cabin will be supplied with one table, two chairs, heating, lighting, ventilation and wireless internet.

The LOC together with FIS will make the final allocation after receipt of the preliminary entries. Wax cabins must be registered by 31<sup>st</sup> of October 2024.

### Prices for additional wax cabins

Single cabin (approx. 6 x 2,4 m) 3000 CHF (excl. VAT)

Double unit (one large space approx. 6 x 4,8 m) 6000 CHF (excl. VAT)

Invoices must be paid until: 1<sup>st</sup> December 2024.

### Wax trucks

At the Granåsen venue one wax vehicle/truck per team with maximum dimension 20 x 10 m (when extended) will have permission to park. Team needs to register their wax vehicle/truck with the by 31<sup>st</sup> of October 2024 via the FIS Online Registration System. All wax vehicles/trucks will be allocated at the Cross-Country team area. Teams arriving with wax trucks are not entitled to a wax cabin. There will be no space for small trailers in addition to the wax truck.

### Grinding trucks and trailers

No grinding trucks or trailers can be parked in the cross-country team area due to limited space. We offer all nations with grinding truck a dedicated parking nearby the team hotels, for rental. Location TBC.

### SRS Industry

Member companies of SRS need to register via the FIS online system. In cooperation with SRS, LOC will confirm wax cabins as well as parking spaces. There will be no space for SRS waxing trucks/trailers. The price for each cabin is 3000 CHF (excl. VAT).

## 7.5 Accreditation and Course Access

### 7.5.1 Accreditation

#### **Art. 9.1.4 Transferable accreditations for Team Officials**

Up to 50% of the above number of team official accreditations may be exchanged during the Championships to accommodate different coaches and support staff in the different events. The accreditation card of the departed official must be returned to the LOC in exchange for a new one. Access passes to the Team and Restricted Areas will be provided to the teams to distribute internally, based on the above quotas.

### Accreditation

The main accreditation office will be nearby the city square. There will also be a sub accreditation center in Granåsen. Information about exact location and opening hours TBC.

The accreditations will be approved according to the registrations in the FIS Entry. The FIS season accreditation will not be valid.

Those who don't register through the FIS online entry system need to apply for accreditation. This includes the Para Cross-Country athletes and teams. For Para the course bib distribution will be communicated at a later stage.

The bibs will be distributed at the Race Office.

The seminar will be relevant for both doctors and physiotherapist, and we hope to see as many as possible at this event, the day before the opening ceremony. The seminar program will be announced in more detail in a later communication.

A Team Doctors Meeting will be held at the end of the seminar.

### **7.6.4 Insurance**

All athletes need the insurance arranged by their NSA. LOC is not responsible for any injuries of the athletes neither for the damage or lost property.

## **7.7. Anti-Doping**

Anti-Doping control of all events is compulsory.

The FIS Anti-Doping Rules compiled in accordance with the World Anti-Doping Code define all by-laws concerning anti-doping controls.

The LOC of the FIS World Championships are responsible for the arrangements for the post-competition doping controls. The Anti-Doping Control Station will be situated near to the location where the press conference is taking place in the Venue Granåsen, and with sub-center for Anti-Doping control near to the Medal Plaza.

## **A clean, conscious, and honest championship!**

The FIS Nordic World Ski Championships Trondheim 2025's Anti-Doping work is value-based and a fully integrated part of our organization. The Anti-Doping mission is based on the approach; clean, conscious and honest. Our statement aims to elaborate on the importance of extensive Anti-Doping work with increased knowledge and awareness.

Anti-Doping Norway will provide education activities according to the requirements of WADA's International Standard for Education (ISE) and FIS. The activities will include, among other things:

- Honestly campaign leading up to and during the WSC with clear voices that are committed to clean sport
- Outreach program for athletes and support personnel during the WSC
- Visibility of a clean sports message in the WSC arena

The FIS Nordic World Ski Championships Trondheim 2025 has the ambition to be the most sustainable WSC of all time. When Trondheim again hosts a major championship, we have set ourselves high goals to minimize our environmental impact and be a social and inclusive arena and give a profit back to sport.

The WSC-arena you will be competing in has been built to promote public health and activities in everyday life. The development of the facility has won awards for its work with the environment and recycling. Several of the buildings produce their own energy through solar cells, and the energy we use comes from water and wind power in the region. On the days when there is no world skiing championship, the facility bustles with life with everything from exercisers, meetings for the elderly and children and young people who are physically active with ski games and a recruiting facility for jumping. Granåsen also acts as an entrance portal for miles of ski slopes in the hilly and beautiful Bymarka.

Our sustainability strategy is based on the UN's sustainability goals, and we have chosen to focus on six goals where we can make the biggest difference: good health and quality of life, industry, innovation and infrastructure, less inequality, responsible consumption, and production, stopping climate change and cooperation to reach the goals.

Equality and equal opportunities are a central part of our strategy. We are proud to be the first skiing WC with equal prize money, more equal distances for women and men, and more exercises for women in combined.

In order to achieve our sustainability plan, we have initiated many different measures and projects on the way to the WC. This is everything from the World Cup to a work-inclusive arena, reducing our plastic use and promoting reuse and recycling. We will measure our measures and after the WC we will deliver a full-fledged climate report. Here everyone must report on everyone on our emissions within energy, purchasing, waste, transport and food and drink. The climate account will be used by the next organizer of the WC, Falun 2027, to become even better!

Together we will create the most sustainable Ski WC ever, for winters to come!

### What are we doing?

- **World-class waste management:** World-class waste management: We prioritize reuse and recycling, aiming for 40% material recycling and a maximum of 2% food waste.
- **Eco-friendly transportation:** No parking at Granåsen venue. Spectators from Trondheim city center is encouraged to use shuttle buses, walk, bike, or ski. Spectators from surrounding regions are encouraged to use public

transportation. The LOC has 100 vehicles, the majority of which will be electric.

- **Locally sourced food:** Trøndelag is a renowned culinary region with excellent produce from well-managed agriculture, our fjords, and the mountains. We will serve locally sourced food to hungry attendees at the WSC.
- **Sustainable procurement:** We have created a purchasing list for the entire organization that prioritizes sustainable purchases. The top question is, "Do we really need this?" We recommend renting or leasing instead of buying whenever possible.
- **Packaging:** We will serve hundreds of thousands of meals during the WSC. Packaging is therefore important. We are taking control of packaging in our venues and finding solutions that have the lowest environmental impact and produce the least waste.
- **"PlasticSmart":** We are reducing the use of plastic and aim to eliminate all single-use plastic.
- **Carbon emission:** We will measure everything we do. Falun 2027 and other organizers can use the data and accounting to become even better!
- **Social Sustainability**
- **Equal opportunities:** Equal prize money and equal events for women and men.
- **Public health:** On the road to the WSC, we have engaged the entire region through AktiVM, including children's ski races, WSC trails in the municipalities, and community knitting. AktiVM is based on the ABC framework: Act, Belong, Commit.
- **Work inclusion:** All procurement of goods and services is a new opportunity for inclusion. When we needed to clear the forest around the trails and the new 50 km route, we used Hogst AS. This is social entrepreneurship in practice, recruiting and employing former convicts, giving them jobs, good wages, and pride.

### What can YOU do?

- **Travel Smart:** Choose the most direct flight routes, avoid privat jets, consider bus or train options to Trondheim. In Trondheim: use the athlete's shuttle from the hotel and Granåsen.
- **Reduce, Reuse, Recycle:** Minimize your waste, sort waste correctly. Avoid single-use plastics in all forms.
- **Reduce plastic bags:** Bring your own plastic bottle, bag or rucksack to store clothes and equipment while competing.

- **Save Energy:** Turn off lights and electronics when not in use and unplug chargers when they're not needed.
- **Lead by Example:** Your actions can inspire fans, fellow athletes, and future generations. Use your social media platforms to share your sustainable practices and encourage others to follow suit.
- **Speak Up:** If you see opportunities for improvement, don't hesitate to share your suggestions with us.
- **Together for winters to come!** Let's make this a World Championships where environmental responsibility is a point of pride.
